

SUPPORTING INFORMATION REQUIRED BY RELEVANT AUTHORITIES FOR APPLICATIONS INVOLVING WORKS AFFECTING THE POOLE HARBOUR SPECIAL PROTECTION AREA (SPA)

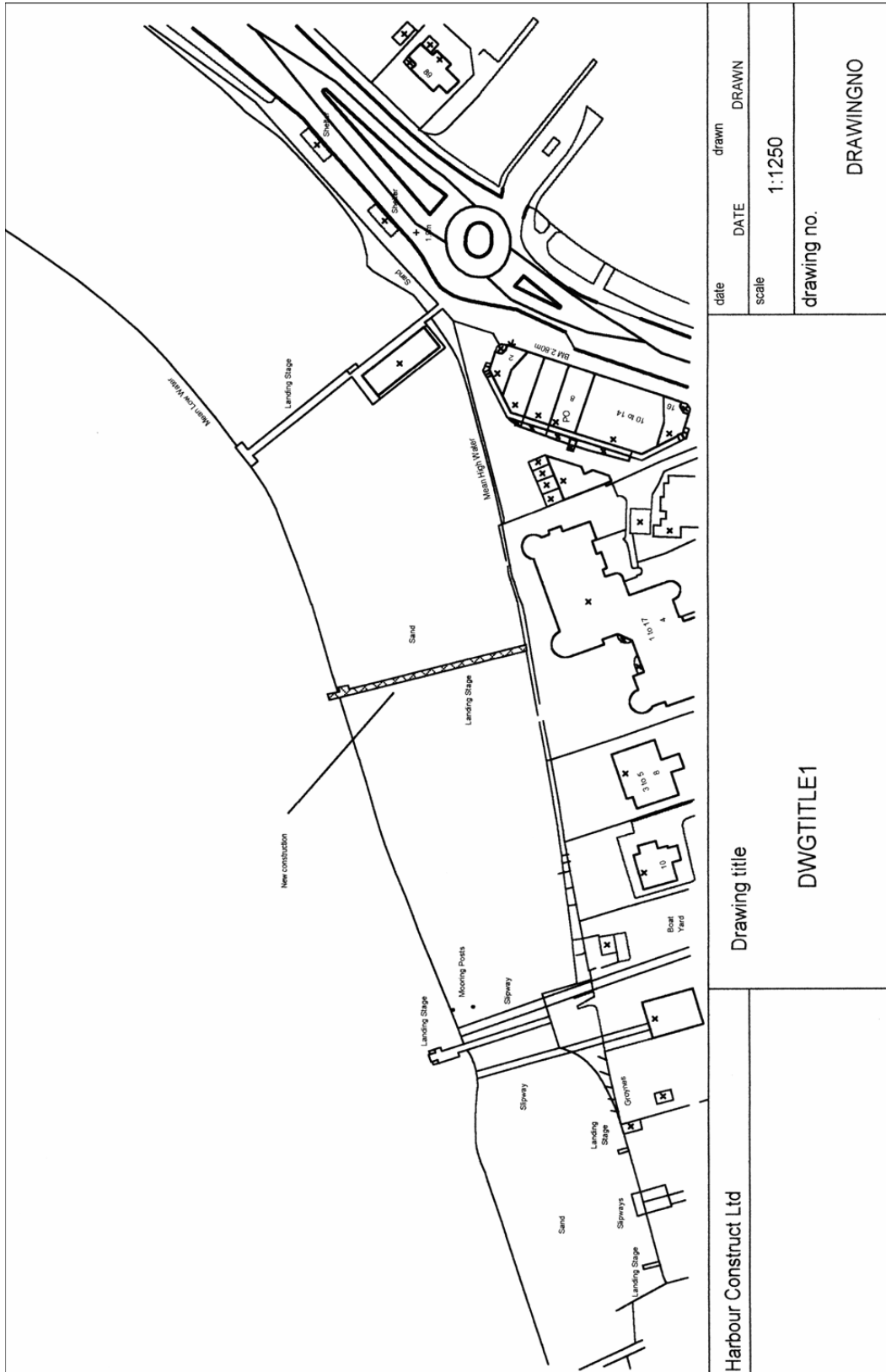
The following information should be supplied in support of the application requirements of the Authority to whom you are applying for works which could affect the Poole Harbour SPA. Works include all new structures or extensions of structures (e.g. jetties, slipways or ramps), dredging, or other licensable activities. N.B. Further information may be requested in some cases.

1. A statement of the purpose and justification for the proposed works, including potential impacts and any measures that will be taken to mitigate those impacts.
2. A full description of the proposed structure including, detailed scale drawings with elevations, the relationship of the proposal to existing structures and a method statement for construction.
3. A set of dated photographs taken at low water showing the application site and the foreshore either side of the proposed works.
4. The mapping at a 1 : 1250 scale of all artificial and natural obstructions to viewlines (e.g. topography, trees, etc) occurring within the SPA and up to 100 metres either side of the application site. *(See example on reverse)*
5. A statement of the current and future requirements for maintenance operations associated with the works.
6. A statement of the potential environmental benefits of the scheme and any additional works that could provide additional environmental gains (e.g. removal of redundant neighbouring jetties or ramps, removal of swing moorings etc).

In cases where an Appropriate Assessment is deemed necessary the following information may additionally be required:

7. A description of the current disturbance levels experienced in the proximity of the application site, including an assessment of current levels of recreational activities.
8. An assessment, from a recognised authority, on the value of the application site to birds. This could be gained from consulting existing relevant bird distribution data and / or through an assessment of the current usage of the area by birds. The latter must include observations made when the site is available to feeding and / or roosting birds. Bird surveys should always include winter observations made at low water during the quieter times of the day (ideally dawn and dusk).
9. A brief description, by a recognised authority, of the intertidal habitat that would be affected, with particular reference to the potential value to feeding birds.
